<u>Friday - Sunday, September 23 - 25</u>

Pre-Trip Option: Arrive early and enjoy one of the England's most loved fiber festivals, Yarndale! We'll facilitate your early arrival at historic Holdsworth House, in Halifax. Zip over to nearby Skipton, to attend the Yarndale market and workshops as you like. Rest, relax and get ready for the tour.

Monday - Tuesday, September 26 & 27

Setting the scene. Flights arrive at Manchester Airport, UK or meet the group there. Our first days are based in Halifax, at the iconic Holdsworth House Hotel. We'll be exploring the area and taking in an overview of Britain's textile history from the middle ages to the late 19th century. Stops include Halifax's Piece Hall and Shibden Hall, getting to know British breeds with our friend, Zoe Fletcher ("The Woolist"), and a visit to the home of the Bronte sisters. Evenings are for enjoying a drink and knitting camaraderie in the wonderful gardens (or cozy pub, in cases of rain) at Holdsworth House.

Wednesday, September 28

Deep history, soaring cathedral. Today is devoted to a visit in the town of Durham. We'll make our way up its winding medieval streets to the cathedral, castle and university. No visit to England's northlands would be complete without time in this cathedral, begun in the days of the Normans and completed as a gothic masterpiece. Then we're off to our beautiful hotel by the beach. Knitting at the shoreline anyone?

Thursday - Friday, September 29 & 30

Splendid Northumberland. We're in England's northernmost county now. Perfect for exploring the castle at Alnwick (young wizards and witches have been spotted learning to fly their brooms on its expansive lawns), visiting some very special Wensleydale sheep and angora goats, stopping in at one of our favorite yarn shops in all of Britain, enjoying dinner in a "tree house" and more!

Saturday, October 1

A day in the Dales. Saturday is devoted to exploring the Yorkshire Dales. We'll drive through lush valleys and across the moors, stopping to take in the wonderful villages, markets and sights. We'll also be visiting the last of the area's working mills, now restored and in production once again. On returning to our castle – oh, by the way, we're staying in a castle – we'll have a workshop to brush up on time-honored Yorkshire knitting techniques.

Sunday - Tuesday, October 2 - 4

The Lake District. Famous as a picturesque retreat from Britain's urban centers, the Lake District is full of places and people to make your heart sing. We'll learn about Beatrix Potter's legacy that led to conservation of the district's landscape and rare sheep breeds. We'll also spend time with sheep keepers, wool artisans and designers who keep the area at the leading edge of contemporary British wool work. Add in a wander in the hills, time to peruse shops & galleries, plus fantastic food and fare and you've got the makings of a perfect finale to our journey.

Wednesday, October 5

Farewell to thee, Britannia! Time to head back to Manchester Airport and catch our flights home.
